Memories

Michael John Sexton, born 17 January 1952 in Melbourne Victoria to Michael 'Mick' Sexton and Joan (nee Stebbing) Sexton (both dec).

Mike was the oldest of 7 children. His brothers are Shane and Simon, his sisters Bronwyn, Tracey (dec), Cindy and Gabrielle. He grew up in Glenroy, Melbourne.

He attended Oak Park Primary School, Glenroy West Primary School, St. Bernard's College Junior School Moonee Ponds and St. Bernard's College Senior School West Essendon.

Mike was awarded a Commonwealth Scholarship in 1969 to complete a degree at the University of Melbourne. In 1973 he graduated with an honours degree in Science, majoring in Geophysics.

From 1974 to 1975 he attended the University of Hawaii, Honolulu, USA as a student for a Master's Degree in science. Michael did not complete this degree. He always said that without his family support (specifically his mother, Joan) he found it difficult to stay on task. He did spend his time helping others with their assessments for their own degrees.

Mike joined the Bureau of Mineral Resources (BMR) in 1976 and retired from Geoscience Australia (GA) 38 years later in 2014. His job provided the opportunity for him to visit many places in Australia and around the world.

He started his career as a geophysicist after seeing an advertisement for a position with the Australian Antarctic Division in the paper. He first went to sub-Antarctic Macquarie Island in 1977, he then continued his adventures at Mawson Base in Antarctica in 1979.

He met his wife Lorraine at Macquarie Hostel in 1977 and they married in 1982. They had four children Michael (b. 1982), Christopher (b. 1985), Anthony (b.1988), and Olivia (b. 1989). Mike was a father-in-law to Alice (m. 2011), Rebecca (m. 2015) and Ellen (m. 2018). In recent years, he became an adored grandfather to Clark (b. 2015), James (b. 2016), George (b. 2018), Thomas (b. 2019), and Riley (b. 2020).

He was an active member of the Tuggeranong Bulldogs Football Club and of the South Canberra-Tuggeranong Athletics Club. His valued efforts saw him achieve life membership with both clubs.
